Pretest and Posttest Survey Results.

There are 38 test items for the in-person session, and 32 test items for the virtual session. Due to space constraints and the extensive nature of the results, detailed test results for each of the items are not included in this paper. Interested readers can obtain these results by contacting the author directly.

Nonsignificant items in the virtual session include:

- I know some physical and psychological challenges that the elderly have to face. ($p = 0.004$)
- I know some social stereotypes against the elderly. ($p = 0.003$)
- I know what primary care specialties are. ($p = 0.002$)
- I know what a typical working environment is like for a physician. ($p = 0.003$)
- I know the education pathway one needs to take to become a doctor. ($p = 0.002$)
- I know the difference between cardiac arrest and heart attack. ($p = 0.01$)
- I feel comfortable in practicing these basic steps in a simulated situation. ($p = 0.003$)
- I know college application procedures. ($p = 0.002$)
